list so it won't be long before I am on my way.

My new job here sure keeps me on the jump, Irarely get to bed before twelve and have to be up at five thirty so as to get the men up They are using practically every body in the barracks on work details, it is a job to find enough to set a watch.

There were another big gang arrived in the O.G, U. yesterday, we hope it will relax some of this working party business on us. That


remains to be seen.

Biddle said his wife told him that the Navy has made a new man of him, he said he didn't think he was as good since he was twenty. I got him a week-end leave yesterdat, it took him all day to get over it, I don't think he has quite recovered yet. All I have to do now is fig ure a way to get one myself. Biddle isn't on the 'Be ready' list. It looks as if we are going to be split up at last. This seems like an awful short letter but you must remember that the type doesn't take nearly the space that a pencil would. It is so hard to find anything to write about. Bainbridge is always the same mucky place, the only diff erence is that there is a little more mud where we are now than where we used to be. It is the same old story, the O.G.U has just opened and we are the guine pigs again. One consolation is that it won't last as long as the other expermentation did. Well mommy I have to get back on the job as I hear my worries going up the steps from chow and a couple of them have just wome in the office to argue for some liberty, so until the next round up I'll remain your loving husband, Parker.



Dearest Darlin;

Not having received any answer to my last two letters I figured that the Navy has the mail all tangled up that is supposed to come here. I know that somewhere in the mail there is a letter for me.

Biddle and I are getting liberty tonight so I am going to his houde in Wilmington which is twenty six miles from the base and play Bridge. I expect to meet his brother-in- law there who is a C.P.O. aboard the Delta. Biddle and I tried hard to get placed on that ship butwe couldn't get anything done about it. Biddle is the only Water

Tender in the O.GU. and has not been callled as yet.

Tomorrow I am being transferred to the Philadelphia Navy Yard to go aboard the Merchant Ship or I should say The U.S.S. Niborara, if you can say it that is more than I can. I understand it is a merchant ship hauling supplies to South America and Chief Small says it will be good duty. However I expect to find out more about it tonight when I get to Wilmington and talk to Biddles' Brother in law. It is even possible that it won't sail for awhile and that I may get a chance to get home. I am waiting patiently for Biddle to come in off a a work detail so we can get started.

I received a money order from the N.Y. Ship today for what reason I don't know, which I am forwarding to you. Maybe they are going to send one every month which will be O.K. too. It came at about the righr time as I can send them my new address so they can't slip up if


they intend to keep up the good work.

Well Biddle has finally piled in and it is five o'clock and that means we have wasted a half hour of the liberty already and I have as yet to get dressed. So until the next round up Mommy you will send my mail to the U.S.S. NIBORARA, no you had better not write until I get an official address or the permission to have one. Maybe I am not supposed to have one yet.
